The European University Viadrina Frankfurt (Oder) was founded in 1991 and plays an important role as a bridge between Eastern and Western Europe. One third of its 5.000 students come from neighbouring Poland and young people from more than 75 countries study at the Viadrina.

The Viadrina's international and interdisciplinary spirit is put into research practice by its three faculties: the Faculty of Law, the Faculty of Economics and Business Adminstration, and the Faculty of Social and Cultural Sciences.

The Viadrina Summer University

The Summer University is a further contribution to the Viadrina's task of crossing European borders and serving as a bridge between the East and the West. With the Summer University, the European University's Faculty of Social and Cultural Sciences offers a contribution for international graduate education. In the Viadrina's tradition of international and interdisciplinary research, the Summer University in 2007 will explore the role of religion in modern societies.

The Summer University is a cooperative work of the Viadrina's broad network of international universities, including Mickiewicz University Poznan, Central European University Budapest, Charles University Prague, Sciences Po Paris, University of Manchester, University of Texas/Austin, University of California/Berkeley, and New York University.

Frankfurt (Oder)

Frankfurt's appearance and history is deeply intertwined with the town center location of the Oder river. Buildings, such as the Town Hall and St. Mary's church display Frankfurt's past as a powerful and rich trading town and as a member of the Hanseatic League. Today, the Oder is the border river to Poland and faces the challenges of serving as a gateway to the East. The lively Polish neighbouring town Słubice is within ten minutes walking distance from the university and Germany's capital city Berlin can be reached within one hour by train.

Frankfurt is a green city beautifully located at the river with a promenade, parks and an attractive countryside.

In an international and interdisciplinary atmosphere, the Viadrina Summer University brings together leading scholars from different backgrounds, such as sociology, political sciences, history, and linguistics.

Religion and Modernity The Societal Determination of Religion and its Cultural Potential

The Viadrina Summer University attempts to provide an appropriate description of the role of religion in modern societies.

We will study the impact of modernity on religion and, vice versa, the influence religion exerts on modern life worlds. Pivotal to this approach is the assumption that religion is not only constantly challenged and changed by processes of modernization, such as pluralization, individualization, or functional differentiation. Rather it must also be considerd as one of societies driving forces to modernization. The interaction of religion and modernization is expressed in the relationship between religion and democracy, religion and the rule of law, religion and education, religion and art, religion and nationalism, as well as in the role of Islam in modern societies.

Program

The program of the Viadrina Summer University consists of four core courses, four workshops, lectures and German language classes (on demand). The language of instruction and reading is English.

Additionally, we offer a variety of excursions, one of them on "Hidden Treasures and Monastries in Berlin and Brandenburg" and an extensive cultural program for evenings and weekends.

The registration fee of 750.00 Euros covers tuition, materials, and accommodation.
