MaMuD 3 - Mapping Multimodal Dialogue

Mapping Multimodal Dialogue (MaMuD) is an (informal) international workshop that brings together a multidisciplinary community of researchers, both junior and senior, interested in the cognitive underpinnings of multimodal dialogue, which is defined as the basic setting of language use, with dialogue partners exchanging verbal as well as non-verbal (manual gestures, head gestures, eye gaze) information. The aim of the workshop is to foster discussion among participants on main theoretical issues, in particular how the verbal and the non-verbal can be integrated into a single model of language and language use. A particular focus of attention of MaMuD 3 (via two keynotes) is what role non-verbal expressions play in L1 and L2 language acquisition and/or L2 teaching.
