Seminar Tutorial

How to Write an Outline Proposal for a Research Paper/Master's Thesis

<u>Check list</u> for an outline proposal:

- **1.** Lead to the topic of the research paper: why chosen, why relevant?
- 2. Brief description of the topic (and demarcation from related issues which will not be discussed)
- **3.** Brief and preliminary critical review of the literature and status of research on the topic
- **4.** Reasons for the focus of the paper/thesis
- **5.** Derivation and discussion of the <u>major argument</u> (in German: "Fragestellung") of the paper/thesis this is the key to success! <u>Clarification</u>: the argument needs to be precise and clear, needs to fit the scope of the paper. An argument is something that someone can reasonably disagree with.
- **6.** Elaboration of the major argument: the reasoning behind, the various facets (and what is interesting, looks relevant but is excluded)
- 7. Derivation and formulation of a hypothesis to be tested/a thesis to be discussed, "smaller" questions and arguments as components of the major argument
- **8.** Clarification of central terms, academic concepts
- **9.** Description and explanation of the approach chosen, discussion of methodology
- **10.** Explanation of the organization and structure of the paper/thesis
- **11.** Survey of relevant material to be used and reasons for selection
- 12. Preliminary table of contents
- 13. Preliminary bibliography

<u>Scope:</u> about 2 pages for research paper, about 10 pages for masters thesis (including name, address of author, email address, working title of paper/thesis) plus preliminary bibliography
