The event will be in person and the workshop's working languages are English and German. Format of the presentations:

- **Academic presentations**

PhD students are invited to give a short academic presentation lasting between 15 and 20 minutes; this will be followed by a general discussion. Academic presentations should focus on some aspect of your current research and may include an idea or a section from a chapter, or a specific focus on a concept, a theoretical reflection, a methodological approach, an analysis of a delineated idea, a passage or corpus, or discussion of pilot data. Works in progress are also welcome.

- **Short presentations**

MA students are invited to give a 5-10 minute talk on their final research project. The purpose of this panel is to offer MA students the possibility of talking about their final project and sharing their goals, practical issues, theoretical problems, etc.

Presenters

Presenters might want to prepare a PowerPoint presentation, a paper handout, or both. Your handout might include short quotations with translation into English or German (if relevant), bibliographical references, or an overview of the main points of your talk/research.
